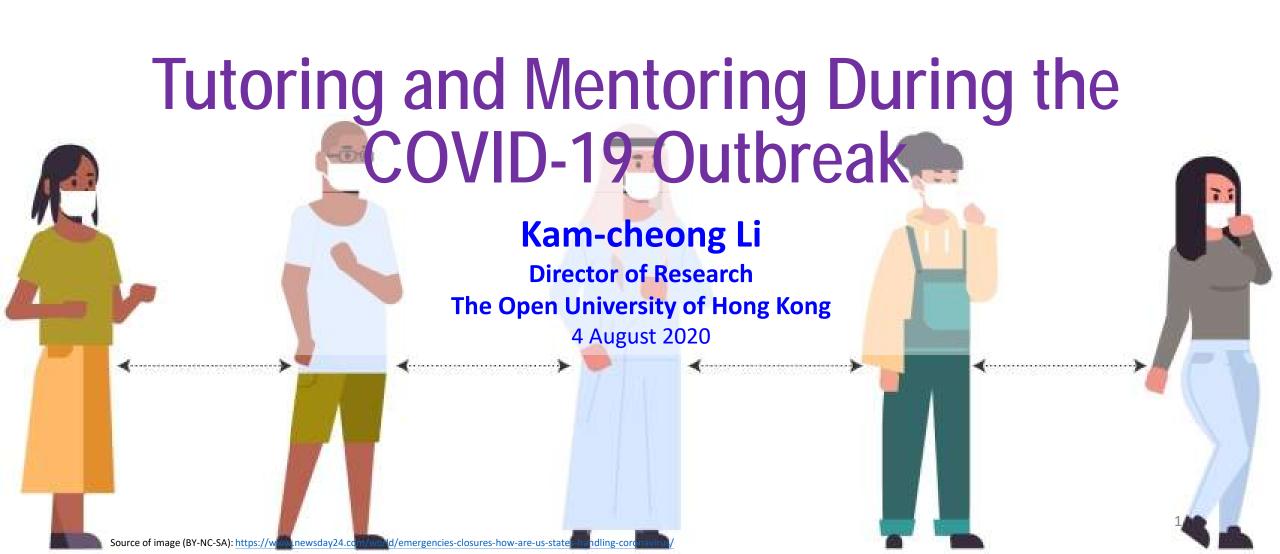
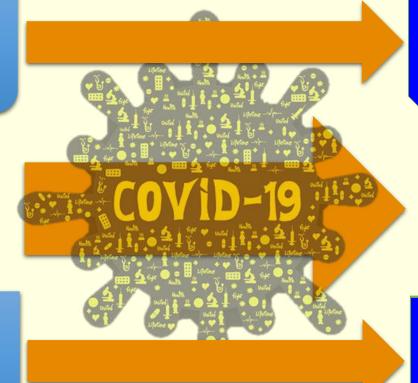

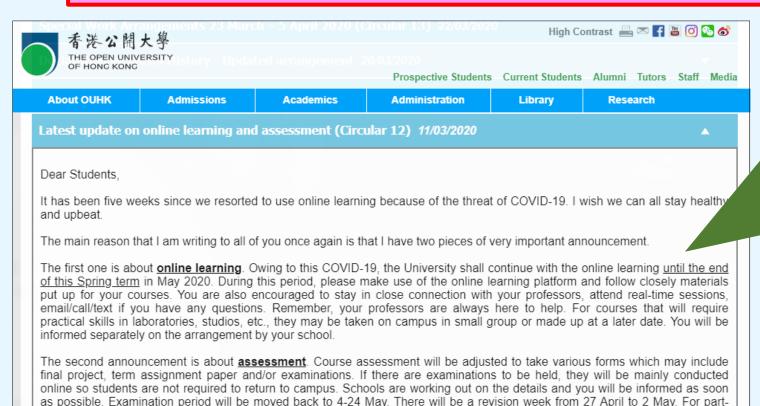

Dear Students,

It has been five weeks since we resorted to use online learning because of the threat of COVID-19. I wish we can all stay health and upbeat.

The main reason that I am writing to all of you once again is that I have two pieces of very important announcement.

The first one is about <u>online learning</u>. Owing to this COVID-19, the University shall continue with the online learning <u>of this Spring term</u> in May 2020. During this period, please make use of the online learning platform and follow closely materials put up for your courses. You are also encouraged to stay in close connection with your professors, attend real-time sessions, email/call/text if you have any questions. Remember, your professors are always here to help. For courses that will require practical skills in laboratories, studios, etc., they may be taken on campus in small group or made up at a later date. You will be informed separately on the arrangement by your school.

The second announcement is about <u>assessment</u>. Course assessment will be adjusted to take various forms which may include final project, term assignment paper and/or examinations. If there are examinations to be held, they will be mainly conducted online so students are not required to return to campus. 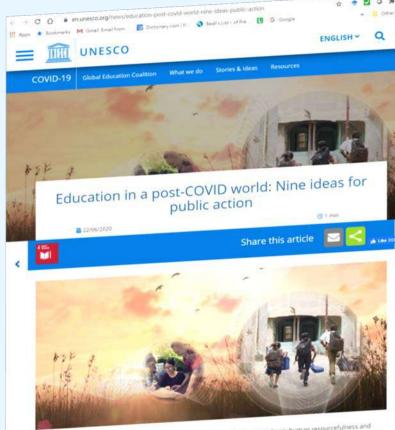

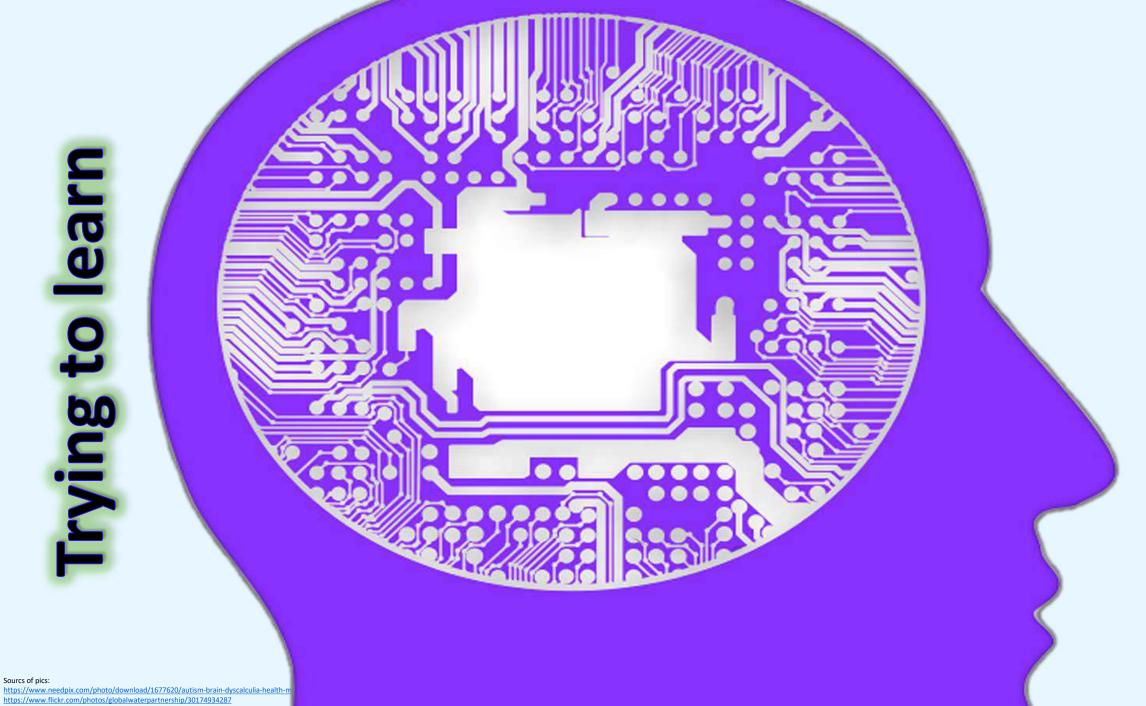

## For learning to take place effectively

## Cognitive

- New knowledge / skills presentation to / identification by students
- Engaging learners to tasks for understanding and integrating the knowledge / skills to existing competence



## Psychological

- Readiness to learn (mental, affective & social factors)
- Efforts to learn / attention strength



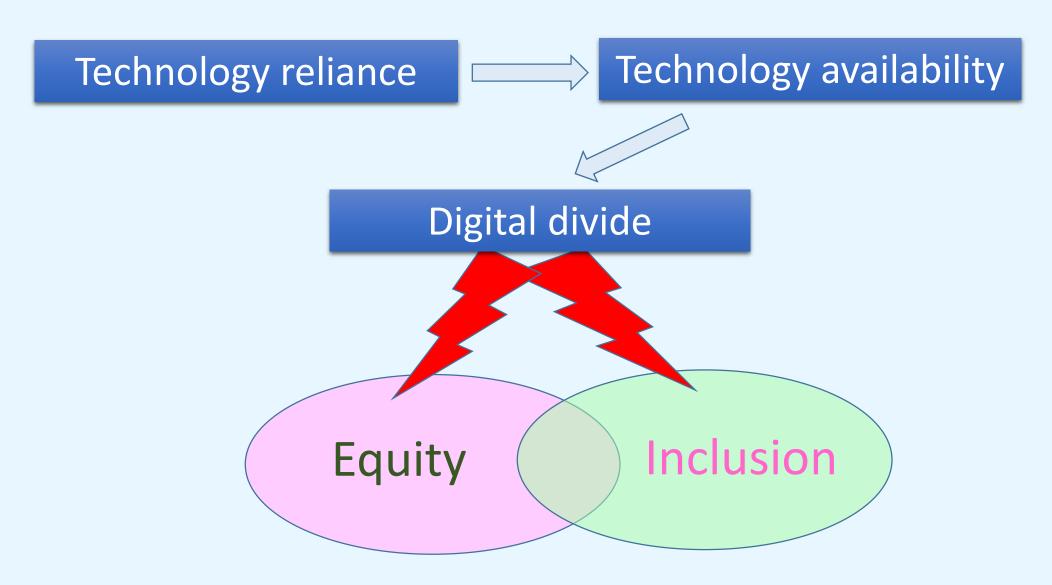
- Memory limit
- Activity for memory strength or link to existing knowledge / skills

## Are we on the right track in tutoring and mentoring?

- Providing
  - information of/about the target learning item
  - platform for students to identify the target learning item
- Organizing learning activities to integrate the item into existing knowledge
- Developing the learners competence in the target area
- Making learners
  - psychologically ready to learn the target item
  - willing to keep making efforts to learn in the target area
- Helping learners
  - retain what has been learned in the long term
  - ready to use what has been learned as part of their competence

- Am I presenting the information effectively?
- To what extent can individual students do this effectively through the task I assign?
- Have I made my students eager to acquire this, and think about/do this?
- Next week, to what extent my students will still have this with them?
  - > Every learner is different.
  - > Every teaching situation is different.
  - **►** What works in the past may not work again.
  - > Ready to use new technology?
  - > Ready for changes?

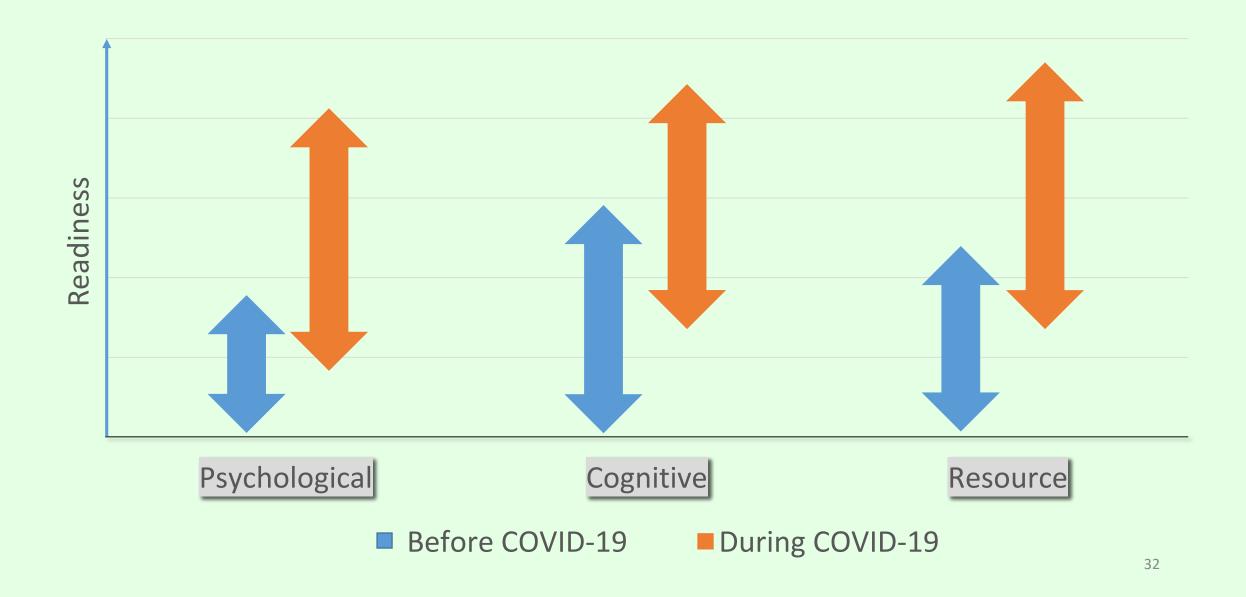

Classes (https://www.nyu.edu/about/leadership-university-administration/office-of-the-president/communications/nyu-returns-looking-ahead-academics-and-student-life-2020-2021.html)	<ul> <li>Classes will take three forms in 2020-2021: 1) in-person; 2) online; and 3) blended</li> <li>Classroom will be in physical distancing settings (2m between students; 3m between students and faculty + less density)</li> <li>Large classes (enrolments of 40+) will be taught remotely, or will break into tutorials, recitation sessions, or other formats for small group, in-person interactions</li> </ul>
Attendance	<ul> <li>Every class (including in-person classes) will be available to attend remotely</li> <li>Many in-person classes will have special online sections reserved for students who are studying remotely</li> <li>"Go Local" option – eligible students can enroll and take a number of in-person classes in another NYU location (that is opened) which they can safely travel there from surrounding areas (<a href="https://www.nyu.edu/academics/studying-abroad/go-local.html">https://www.nyu.edu/academics/studying-abroad/go-local.html</a>)</li> </ul>
Course taking	<ul> <li>Flexible semester options (Undergraduate) – a lighter full-time load (no less than 12 credits) in either Fall 2020 or Spring 2021, combined with taking classes in January 2021 or Summer 2021, which will be supported by tuition grants (<a href="https://www.nyu.edu/students/student-information-and-resources/registration-records-and-graduation/Flexible-Semester-Options.html">https://www.nyu.edu/students/student-information-and-resources/registration-records-and-graduation/Flexible-Semester-Options.html</a>)</li> </ul>

Classes (https://covid19.columbia.edu/news/president-bollinger-outlines-plans-safereturn-campus)	<ul> <li>School will operate on a three-term cycle. The fall term will start on September 8 (which is similar to previous years), but the spring and summer terms in 2021 will start earlier than usual</li> <li>Each term will offer a choice of immersive courses (that occur in an A or B block for each semester) by being divided into two, equal-length sequential blocks (example from Department of History: <a href="https://history.columbia.edu/courses/">https://history.columbia.edu/courses/</a>)</li> <li>Courses will be offered in multiple formats, with an online option for almost every courses</li> <li>Graduate and professional schools will have flexibility to design their own reopening plans, considering their coursework's specific nature and the preferences of student and faculty</li> <li>Individual schools will have their own planning, on behalf of the university's overall approach</li> </ul>

Journalism School (https://covid19.columbia.edu/news/journalism-school-describes-plan-hybrid-instruction-fall)	<ul> <li>Hybrid teaching, to provide significant in-person teaching and online teaching, one-on-one counselling, and field reporting opportunities</li> <li>Student who does not wish to attend a class in person will be able to choose to learn and work remotely</li> <li>For field reporting, students must submit a reporting proposal that includes public health protocols, transportation, and other specifics and seek for approval of faculty supervisor and dean</li> </ul>
School of International and Public Affairs (https://covid19.columbia.edu/news/school-international-and-public-affairs-offers-further-clarification-fall-plans)	<ul> <li>All Fall 2020 courses will be offered online for the entire semester., with a considerable number of these classes will be taught on campus</li> <li>Class taught on campus will be subjected to social distancing requirements (in-person capacity will be 28% of the standard seating capacity)</li> <li>Almost every class sessions will be recorded and made available for students on CourseWorks. Audio-visual capacity in all classrooms is also being upgraded in order to facilitate teaching of online and in-person students</li> </ul>
Nursing School (https://covid19.columbia.edu/news/update-nursing-school-fall-2020-reopening-plans)	<ul> <li>All didactic courses will be delivered online for Fall 2020, except simulation instruction, clinical rotations, and three PhD courses</li> <li>Didactic courses will include both synchronous content delivery and asynchronous content delivery</li> <li>Students are required to complete mandated COVID-19 training before beginning clinical rotations</li> <li>Clinical placement in environments with known COVID-19 positive patients is voluntary</li> </ul>

Course Scheduling  (https://www.cuny.edu/coronavirus/guida nce-on-academic-continuity-to- campuses/# Toc46411730, Considerations: Course Scheduling – In- Person Instruction)	<ul> <li>Design or update course schedules to:</li> <li>1. minimize number of students, faculty, and staff travelling on public transportation during peak hours</li> <li>2. reduce overlap and number of people in circulation on campus</li> <li>3. minimize disruptions in case COVID-19 conditions require all courses to be conduct online after semester has started</li> </ul>

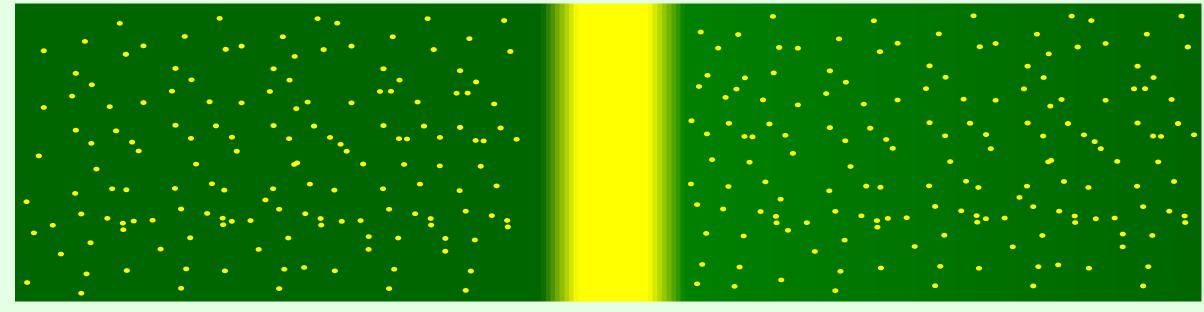
## Challenges

- Online courses must have the same quality as face-to-face teaching courses.
- Online courses emphasize:
  - ➤ Flexibility in learning → institution to provide suitable choices
  - Customisation of curriculum > Curriculum to be adapted to learning needs
  - ➤ Autonomy in learning → student to be able to master their learning

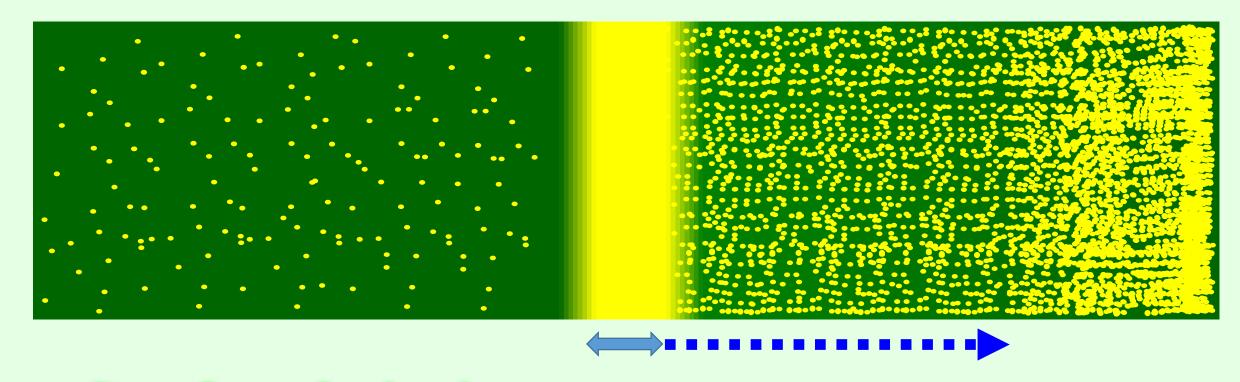
Green: face-to-face learning

## Coming decade of online learning

- Much greater demand for:

- Some open universities: gaining more students and popularity; some others: losing their distinctiveness, niche and competitive advantages.
