1 INTRODUCTION

This report offers an account of the activities of the AAOU conducted in 2018, as well as the decisions of the Executive Committee and General Body Meetings. It also incorporates the 32nd AAOU Annual Conference 2018 event and some of the actions taken based on the Minutes of the Meetings.

2 ACTION THROUGH CIRCULATION

2.1 AAOU_EB_2018_01

The items were submitted for action by the Executive Committee Members on 25 September 2018:

- 2.1.1 The granting of the 2018 AAOU Meritorious Award to Prof. Dr. Naveed Malik, Rector of the Virtual University of Pakistan (Pakistan)
- 2.1.2 Renewal Proposal from Emerald Publishing Services for the AAOU Journal for 5 years (2019-2023) amounting to £54,280.00 (USD71,125.80) or £10,856.00 (USD14,226) per year
- 2.1.3 Proposal to Establish the AAOU Collaborative Research Program with Funding Allocation of USD18,000 for 2019

3 MEETINGS AND CONFERENCES

3.1 AAOU Annual Meetings of the Executive Committee and General Body 2018

The 33rd AAOU Annual Meeting of the Executive Committee (EC) and the 32nd Annual Meeting of the General Body (GB) were held on 23 October 2018 and 25 October 2018 respectively in Melia Hanoi Hotel, Hanoi, Vietnam was the host for the 32nd AAOU Annual Conference.

Minutes of the EC and GB meetings in 2018 were circulated via email to all members for their comments and feedback. There was no need to make any amendments or corrections to the minutes.

3.2 AAOU Annual Conference 2018

The 31st AAOU Annual Conference was hosted successfully by Hanoi Open University in Hanoi, Vietnam from 23 to 25 October 2018 with the theme 'Open Education in Human Resource Development in Asia's Period of Integration'.

The 32nd AAOU Annual Conference brought together about 327 delegates who came from over 16 different countries. The participants comprised Vice-Chancellors, Rectors, Presidents, scholars, senior administrators, and policy-makers representing the open universities in the Asian region and other ODL institutions or organizations. The conference was officiated by Dr. Truong Tien Tung, President of Hanoi OPen University; Dr. Melinda dP. Bandalaria, President of the AAOU; and the Vietnamese Ministry of Education and Training.

The AAOU 2018 featured a two-day pre-conference activities with two plenary sessions and five parallel sessions. The AAOU 2018 Conference program featured three keynote speeches, three plenary panels, and six parallel sessions. The Conference aimed to bring together Asian ODL advocates, academics, administrators, policy-makers, practitioners, scholars, and students in an event that provides a focal point for bringing everyone up to date on the issues, ideas, and developments in the field of open distance learning, with focused discussions on the following sub-themes:

- Human Resource Development in Open Universities
- Open Education in Technical, Vocational, and Skills Development
- Open Education Practices in Foreign Languages and Academic Disciplines
- New Technologies in Open Education

5 AAOU STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTS AND AUDIT REPORT FOR YEAR 2018

According to the audited statement of accounts, the cash and cash equivalents at the beginning of the year 2018 was USD363,730 and the cash and cash equivalents as of 31 December 2018 was USD366,532.13. AAOU granted a subsidy of USD3,000 to meet a portion of the cost for conducting the 32nd AAOU Annual Conference.

The Commonwealth of Learning (COL) provided a grant of CAD5,000 to cover the registration fees and accommodation subsidy of selected participants attending the 32nd AAOU Annual Conference.

6 THE AAOU INTER-UNIVERSITY STAFF EXCHANGE FELLOWSHIP PROGRAMME

The AAOU Inter-University Staff Exchange Fellowship Programme aims to provide a platform for capacity-building and the establishment of sustainable partnerships, as well as fostering the exchange of knowledge and promotion of mutual understanding among staff of Asian open universities.

In 2018, the following four institutions offered fellowships to deserving candidates in the AAOU Inter-University Exchange Fellowship Programme:

- 1. Sukhothai Thammathirat Open University, Thailand (1 slot, 1 successful application)
- 2. Shanghai Open University, China (up to 15 slots, 19 successful applications)
- 3. Korea National Open University, Korea (2 slots, 2 successful applications)
- 4. Universitas Terbuka, Indonesia (2 slots, 2 successful applications)

It was reported that one successful application was identified for the Sukhothai Thammathirat Open Universityfellowships. For the Shanghai Open University, 19 successful applicants were offered fellowships. For both the Korea National Open University and Universitas Terbuka fellowships, two applicants per institution were offered the fellowship.

The President and Secretariat are keen to enhance communication among AAOU members and update them on the latest events and developments at member institutions, as well as provide updated news about the AAOU and ODL field, in order to bring the most recent information directly to scholars and professionals. In 2018, four issues of the eBulletin were published, and three email announcements were delivered. In these e-communications, important events — such as international conferences on open and distance education, the offering of the Inter-University Staff Exchange Fellowship Programme by our member institutions, and the publication of the AAOU Journal — were announced. Also, calls for paper submission, award nomination, and updated news from member institutions were delivered.

10 AAOU INITIATIVES

10.1 ASIAN MOOCs

Dr. Andy Liew Teik Kooi, member of the Asian MOOCs Steering Committee, reported to the Executive Committee that three outputs were generated by the project in 2018 — the Asian MOOCs Learning Portal, the AAOU MOOCs QA Framework and Guidelines for MOOCs Development for AAOU Member Institutions, and the AAOU MOOCs Credit Transfer Policy and Guidelines.

Dr. Liew also stated that there is a goal to encapsulate the various AAOU initiatives by integrating the output of the Accreditation Task Force to work with that of the Asian MOOCs Steering Committee.

An additional budget of USD3,000 on top of the savings of USD5,000 from the previously approved budget for 2018 (amounting to a total working budget of

USD8,000 for personnel, hosting, and meetings/workshops/travel arrangement fees) was proposed by the Asian MOOCs Steering Committee and was approved by the Executive Committee.

The President also thanked the host institutions for the meetings conducted for the project, as this was the reason for the savings from the previously approved budget. She also noted that the report from the Asian MOOCs Steering Committee will be made available in the AAOU website.

10.2 REPORT OF THE PROPOSED OPEN EDUCATION ACCREDITATION SERVICES

Dr. Grace Javier Alfonso presented to the Executive Committee the results of the previously approved proposal to explore the feasibility of offering open education accreditation services. She reported that from the various data gathering methods done by the Task Force (survey questionnaires, in-depth interviews, focus group discussions), the respondents deem accreditation as important to their institutions, and that AAOU has the credibility to offer such services. The second phase of the study, along with an additional budget of USD18,000 on top of the savings from 2018 (USD6,112.99), was proposed by the Task Force and approved by the Executive Committee.

The President also thanked the host institutions for the meetings conducted for the project, as this was the reason for the savings from the previously approved budget. She also noted that the report from the Accreditation Task Force will be made available in the AAOU website.

10.3 PROPOSAL FOR NEW INITIATIVES FOR FUTURE COLLABORATIVE WORK

Prof. Drs. Ojat Darojat presented the proposal for two new AAOU initiatives, namely:

- Writing a book on distance education in Asia
- Collaboration to develop post-graduate degree programs to be undertaken by AAOU member institutions

The proposal was approved in principle by the Executive Committee, and Prof. Drs. Darojat was assigned to take the lead in inviting members for the Task Force who will work on the details of the proposal. Prof. Drs. Darojat also stated that the first meeting will be hosted by Universitas Terbuka. Prof. Zoraini Wati Abas and Dr. Zahid Majeed consequently volunteered for the said Task Force, and it was further suggested by the Executive Committee that potential volunteers from the General Body Meeting may also be explored.

11 CONCLUDING REMARKS

Overall, the year 2018 was successful and eventful. The Association wishes to record its gratitude to all members of the AAOU Executive Committee and General Body for their support and cooperation. The AAOU is also grateful to COL for continuing its sponsorship to support the participation of deserving individuals in the AAOU Annual Conference.
